RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Horse Show, as part of the Eighty-seventh Annual California State Fair, will be held in the arena commencing August 29th, and running each night, up to and including September 7, 1941. The program is subject to change. Proper notice will be given.

All exhibitors must have their horses in the ring promptly on being notified by the Marshal. The time allotment of classes will be adhered to as nearly as possible. Horses may be judged for conformation prior to entering the ring, in order to save time.

In case of any animal being disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that class shall take the prize that has been awarded to such disqualified animal, and the lowest money prize in the class shall go to the reserve number.

An amateur is one who rides and drives for the love of the sport, not for a livelihood. Riders in all hunter and polo classes to be in appropriate costume. Attendants must be neatly and properly dressed on entering the ring.

All protests must be referred to the Board of Directors, whose decision shall be final. No prizes will be awarded when the judges are of the opinion that there is not sufficient merit in the animals exhibited to justify it.

A horse is over 14 hands, 2 inches; a pony not over 14 hands, 2 inches. (Horses, etc., are measured by the hand rather than by the foot. A hand is 4 inches.)

Gaited Saddle Horses must be shown without artificial appliances, except quarter boots. Five-gaited horses will not be allowed to compete in the three-gaited classes. In combination classes horses must be both driven and ridden by the same person.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the show, thus causing unnecessary preparations and expense, a fine of \$10 will be levied on each entry not exhibited when called for by the program, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor (confirmed by the certificate of a veterinary surgeon) be lodged with the Secretary of the Association before the day of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused by either the death of the animal, an accident or contagious or infectious disease.

All changes—hours of judging, etc., will be posted on a blackboard—such posting will be deemed sufficient notice.

AND THE CONTROLLED CON

Conditions of the Following Classifications and How Judged

Rules for Stock Horse or Rein Class Showing

All horses will be worked on yearlings. Rider will be required to demonstrate the ability of his horse in crowding, cutting and turning his animal on the rail of the show ring. The rope will also be used on animals to demonstrate the horse's ability and willingness to work in this manner. Eliminations will be held in the mornings and only the best rated horses will be shown in the show ring at night.

ROADSTERS

A roadster should be a trotter not under 15 hands. Conformation, substance, style of going, action, manners, bitting and shoeing as they are and appear at the time of showing will be considered in judging. To be shown in light harness to an appropriate four-wheeled vehicle. Must be practically sound.

HEAVY HARNESS HORSES SHETLAND HARNESS PONIES HACKNEY HARNESS PONIES

All horses in these classes must be serviceably sound for the purpose for which they are shown. They must have good manners. Extreme knee and hock action alone will not be given the preference over true all-around action. To be shown to an appropriate vehicle. Horses only to count unless the conditions state otherwise.

THREE-GAITED SADDLE HORSES

Should be brilliant and attractive with a walk that is a distinctive—one-two-three-four beat, a balanced springy trot with the hocks well flexed and at all times squarely under the hind feet and squarely behind the fore. Canter—slow and smooth without any perceptible jar as the feet touch the ground. Should have a substantial appearance, but withal graceful.

FIVE-GAITED SADDLE HORSES

The five gaits are Walk, Slow Gait (which goes by any one of three names, Running Walk, Fox Trot, or Slow Pace), Trot, Rack, and Canter. The Walk is again a one-two-three-four gait, only hardly as firm and pronounced a one as in a three-gaited horse. The Slow Gait—scarcely faster than a good walk, with each foot in motion separately but with an airy, feathery action. Rack being similar in smoothness and execution but very much faster and with greater action. The Trot square and firm with extreme speed and brilliance. The Canter—smooth and rhythmic. It should be borne in mind that despite the fact that a five-gaited horse in the Rack and Trot must have speed, it must not be at the expense of balance, as in all the five gaits the horse's legs must be squarely under his body. A five-gaited horse should have lots of brilliance and be possessed of show presence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS—Continued HUNTERS AND JUMPERS

No one may ride more than four horses in any class.

Performance and Conformation.—There is a marked difference between classes for hunters and classes for jumpers. Jumpers are only required to clear the obstacles; they may be hunters but need not be. The most brilliant jumpers are sometimes unsatisfactory hunters. A hunter making a good performance at a jump and just ticking need not necessarily be penalized, and the score of his performance at the jumps does not necessarily decide the award; because careful consideration must be taken of his manners, style of jumping, way of going between jumps, and other features that are important and which make a good hunter. Hunters will be judged on a basis of 30% conformation, 20% manners and style and way of going, 30% for performance and 20% style of jumping unless otherwise stated.

Wings will not be used on any hunter or jumper course unless otherwise stated.

HUNTERS

In hunter classes horses will be judged in taking the jumps according to the following scale of faults:

Ticks and touches will not be scored.

Main fault only scored in cases of touches and knockdowns.

All horses entered in the hunter classes, where conformation counts, may be judged for conformation and way of going previous to being shown in ring.

Any horse not sufficiently under control shall not be allowed to compete.

Horses taking more than 11/2 minutes to complete a course may be disqualified.

Hunters may be eliminated on a basis of conformation and way of going over two

or more jumps prior to showing.

In making their decision the judges shall take into consideration the superiority of form and style of jumping in which the competitors exhibit, and also their capability to carry the weight prescribed in the several classes.

Main fault only scored in cases of touches and knockdowns.

In touch and go classes when horse or rider falls the horse will be given credit for the last jump cleared.

In hunter and jumper classes hard knocks of the wood of brush-jumps will be considered a fault and scored as such.

In any hunter or jumper classes, the judge may order one or more jumps raised in the eliminations.

In jumping in pairs the horses will be scored under the foregoing scale as one horse. Horses taking more than 11/2 minutes to complete a course may be disqualified.

The judges will select such horses in each class as they consider eligible for prizes or commendation, and when they deem a veterinary examination necessary, such examination shall be made before the prizes are awarded.
