the role of downtrodden, embattled gridders, trailing at halftime by 21-0, who provided the thrilling comeback in the epic 35-35 deadlock with hardin-simmons in the grape bowl december 11...

for those tiger adventists who sat dismally through the dour first half watching the lone star eleven take a three-touchdown lead, there was little or no forebodence that the second annual lodi chamber of commerce affair would go down as one of football's greatest ties...

in fact the initial cop score, which came four minutes after the half on an 83-yard drive, was immediately matched by a long scoring pass from little all-american johnny ford to end bob mc chesney, a thorn in the tigers' hide all afternoon... but for the next 20 minutes it was all cop... the next marker in the bengals' long uphill climb came on a le baron - to - ortez pass after the t-whizzer had set it up on a 19-yard end run of his own... this lowered the deficit to 14 points — the score 28-14, as bill mc farland converted his second of five straight efforts... his feat was equaled by the cowboys' paul bailey...

the lone star lead was narrowed to 28-21 when jim price carried the ball over from the hardin-simmons 22 after a fumble had put the tigers in position... it was four touchdowns and four conversions apiece after don hardy took a handoff from le baron on the cowboy 25 and bolted through guard for six, mc farland subsequently toeing the way to a tie... hardy supplied the punch to put the tigers ahead for the first and last time when he scored on a 27-yard off-tackle slant with just seven minutes to play... it was the visitors who added the final and climactic touchdown—another ford-to-mc chesney pass—but pacific's bid for victory in the final seconds was the game's most dramatic moment...

a desperation pass from le baron to price as the gun sounded resulted in a pass interference penalty on hardin simmons, pacific taking over on the texas 30 with one play or nothing...

for the money play le baron shoveled out to hardy on his famed "double spinner," and the fleet fullback went 29 of those 30 yards before mc chesney nailed him from behind... thus a yard prevented orange and black victory, and that same yard consummated the highest scoring tie in the annals of american football...

despite inopportune injuries in key positions, the stockton college football team posted a record of five wins and four losses under the direction of coach gene stagnaro and his assistant, ralph mason... eight of these nine scheduled contests were league tilts, giving the cubs a 5-3 performance in the northern california junior college conference's "a" division...

stagnaro greeted 75 aspirants in pre-season drills in early september, and expectations ran high with enthusiasm during these pre-liminary drills... it was soon evident that this was no ordinary cub squad... but it was soon to be found that neither was this an ordinary nejce, for the 1948 competition was keener than ever in the three year history of the loop...

the jucos successfully passed the initial test by downing a tough band of marin jc stars 13-6 on the baxter turf... however, their elation was short lived as they succumbed to the second half passing of dynamic ed brown in the 31-21 hartnell college defeat. the cubs had led 21-0 at intermission time... they then assembled a string of four successive wins: san mateo jc 25-0, monterey penninsula college 32-0, modesto jc 20-18 — the finest game played in this locality during the '48 season — and pasadena college 20-12

plagued with injuries to both starting and alternating quarterbacks, jack heath and jerry griffin, as well as several disabilities in the line, the cubs dropped the final three contests...

offensive star of the squad was ed macon, whose speedy sprints around the enemy flanks gave him the individual rushing leadership and garnered for himself a backfield spot on the mythical all nojec team...






