In conformity with the rules and regulations governing the activities of Grand Court Officers, I take pleasure in presenting my report for the year 1939-1940, as Grand Senior Beadle in the State of California, to-wit:

By order of the Grand Chief Ranger to the Organization Department created by the last convention, I had the pleasure of being assigned by the said Organization Department, to the Courts of Dis-

trict No. 9, embracing San Francisco and Colma. I visited each Court assigned to me five times, making a total of fifty-five official visits and I am happy to state that the response of these Courts was gratifying to the extent that all the Courts cooperated and all but two initiated candidates during this year. I also attended every meeting of District No. 9 and wish to report that the activities and the attendance more than doubled itself over the previous year.

At the beginning of our Grand Chief Ranger's term he expressed his desire for a Junior Court and I fulfilled that desire by organizing the first Junior Court in the State of California, with a class of 27 candidates, under the name and style of Junior Court Pride of San Francisco No. 1, which meets every second and fourth Friday of each month, at 240 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, with the assistance of Brother Frank Zelich, our Grand Secretary, Brother Adrian Springer, Past Chief Ranger of Court Magnolia, Brother Fred Miller, Financial Secretary of Court California No. 4, Brother Clarence Stern, Treasurer of Court Magnolia No. 2 and Brother Marcus Lafee, Financial Secretary of Court Magnolia No. 2 and Brother Marcus Lafee, Financial Secretary of Court Magnolia No. 2. The membership of said Junior Court has now increased to a total of 30, with a class of candidates scheduled for the month of June, as a greeting to the incoming Grand Chief Ranger.

Aside from these scheduled activities I had the pleasure of attending twenty-three official visits with our Grand Chief Ranger, throughout the State. I wish to call the attention of this convention that the plan submitted by our Grand Chief Ranger has been one of the most concrete forms of activity, although it took the membership nearly seven months to grasp it and I trust that the incoming Grand Chief Ranger will continue said program, as during my visitations I found that it is being worked in all the Courts with good results.

I take this opportunity in expressing my sincere appreciation to the Grand Court Organization Committee for giving me the opportunity of serving the Order and for their kind acceptance of my reports.

To the Grand Chief Ranger I wish to state that it has been a personal pleasure and satisfaction to have been able to be one of his subordinates and to have worked with him during this last year. I cannot praise or thank our Grand Secretary, F. L. Zelich, enough for his devotion and helping hand extended to me during the past year and that of his secretary, Miss Josephine Girimonte.

In conclusion I take this opportunity of extending my congratulations and pledge my continued support to the incoming Grand Chief Ranger to the end that we may have an increase in membership this coming year.

DOCUMENT NO. 19—Resolution to amend Grand Court Laws and Constitution, from Court Shell Mound No. 17, as follows: To the Officers and Members of the Grand Court of California Foresters of America

Convened for the Fifty-First Annual Session, Sacramento, California Brothers:

After due consideration, and keeping in mind the relations of this Order, as compared with the Government of our Country, and desiring to practice the personal rights of free speech and personal opinion, which rights are embodied in the first word of our motto, "Liberty," and comparing certain parts of the Constitution and Laws of the Grand Court of California, as to those granted voting citizens of our Country, and further comparing the Constitution and General Laws of the Foresters of America, we find that the laws of the Grand Court of California conflict, in that they demand of a member, votes which he may not be willing to give, and therefore beg that these laws be amended by the following resolutions, so that our membership may be able to exercise their personal rights as guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States of America.

 Be it Resolved: That Article 2, Section 3, Page 4, of the Grand Court Constitution which reads as follows "The law governing the election of officers of a Subordinate Court shall govern and control the election of delegates and alternates; provided that no ballot cast at said election for delegates or alternates shall be counted unless the names of as many candidates regularly nominated appear upon said ballot as there are delegates or alternates to be elected," be amended, by placing a period (.) after the word "alternates" in the third line of the section, and striking out the balance of the section. The section, when thus amended to read, "The Law governing the election of officers of a Subordinate Court shall govern and control the election of delegates and alternates."

- 2. Be it Resolved: That Article 4, Section 4, Page 6, of the Grand Court Constitution be amended by striking out the last sentence of the section, which at present reads: "All votes cast for Grand Trustees and Supreme Representatives must be for the total number to be elected."
- 3. Be it Resolved: That Article 10, Section 2, Pages 52 and 53 of the Grand Court Constitution of Subordinate Courts, which reads as follows: "Every financial member of the Court shall have an equal part or voice in all property and concerns thereof. It shall be at the option of a member to cast or retain his vote except in the case of a clearance member, or in cases where two-thirds majority or a unanimous consent is required, when the same shall be compulsory, the Chief Ranger excepted. But no member who is not financial upon the books shall have the privilege of voting for any officer of the Court on the night of election. When at any time the vote shall be equal the Chief Ranger shall have the casting vote, except in cases of election of officers, when he may vote, but has no casting vote," be amended by placing a period (.) after the word "vote" in the first line on page 53, and strike out the next thirty-one words. The section when thus amended to read, "Every financial member of the Court shall have an equal part or voice in all property and concerns thereof. It shall be at the option of a member to cast or retain his vote. But no member who is not financial upon the books shall have the privilege of voting for any officers of the Court on the night of election. When at any time the vote shall be equal the Chief Ranger shall have the casting vote, except in cases of election of officers, when he may vote, but has no casting vote."

In keeping with the above, and always considering the rights of members, as compared with the Constitution of the United States of America, and following the system of voting as set forth by that document, we also submit the following:

Be it Resolved: That Article 3, Section 1, Subdivision (b), Page 37 of the Grand Court Constitution of Subordinate Courts be amended by striking out the entire subdivision and recast it to read, "All ballots used at election must be furnished by the Recording Secretary, and shall be delivered by said Recording Secretary to the Woodwards, who shall distribute them to the members present. All ballots must be uniform in size and color. When a Subordinate Court nominates at a meeting previous to the election, printed or mimeographed ballots may be used."

Court Shell Mound No. 17, in the jurisdiction of the Grand Court of California, Foresters of America, begs the consideration of this Grand Court, in convention assembled, to the end that these resolutions be adopted, and that the membership in this Grand Court jurisdiction be given the same rights as members of this Order, as they are given as citizens of the United States of America.

Brother Berliner, maker of the original motion, with the consent of the seconder, accepted the amendment as the original motion. Motion carried.

The Committee on Credentials and Returns made a partial report. Motion made by Grand Secretary F. Zelich and seconded by Supreme Sub-Chief Ranger N. Chas. Brusatori that the report be accepted and the delegates seated. Motion carried.

Motion made by A. Berliner of No. 5 and seconded by Arthur Lewis of No. 20 that we recess until 2:00 p. m. Motion carried. Meeting recessed at 12:15 p. m.

FIRST DAY, AFTERNOON SESSION

May 16, 1940

The meeting was called to order at 2:05 p. m., with Grand Chief Ranger Wm. E. Farrenkopf presiding.

The Grand Chief Ranger announced that where the delegates' credentials do not designate to whom mileage is to be paid, check be drawn in favor of the Court.

By direction of the Grand Chief Ranger the reading of the minutes was deferred to the Friday morning session, where the minutes for both morning and afternoon session of May 16 would be read. Motion made by Grand Secretary F. Zelich and seconded by Grand Trustee Sydney Bernstein that the action of the Grand Chief Ranger be concurred in. Motion carried.

DOCUMENT NO. 20—Report of the Committee to Recodify the Grand Court Laws, as follows:

To the Officers and Members of the Fifty-First Annual Convention Grand Court of California, Foresters of America Sacramento, California

Re: Report of Committee to Recodify the Grand Court Laws Brethren:

Your committee to recodify the Grand Court Laws hereby reports as follows:

During the Convention of the Grand Court held in May, 1939 in San Francisco, upon a motion being made for the appointment of a Special Committee to recodify the Laws of this Grand Court, the Grand Chief Ranger appointed P. G. C. R. James R. Davis, Chairman, A. Van Hulle of No. 17 and Wm. Berger of No. 2 as the Committee. No meeting of this Committee was called by the Chairman

and upon the request of G. C. R. Wm. E. Farrenkopf for a report of the activities of the said Committee, the Chairman P. G. C. R. Davis resigned as a member of the said Committee. A. Van Hulle was thereupon appointed Chairman and Ed Candage of No. 45 was appointed to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Brother Davis. A meeting of this Committee was had on Monday, April 1, 1940, and there were present at that time, G. C. R. Farrenkopf and G. S. Zelich, together with Chairman Van Hulle and Berger.

Subsequent meetings were held by Van Hulle and Berger and it was ascertained that the recodification of the Grand Laws could not be completed nor could a complete report be obtained before the present session of this Grand Court due to the great amount of work required.

It is the desire of your Committee to revise and recast these laws for the purpose of making them more intelligible and understandable to the lay members of our Order. Our Grand Court Laws as they are now written do not run consecutively, are confusing and seem to have been written without regard or thought to the previous or other sections. Our purpose is to completely recast the laws, segregate them in the proper places, reindex and have them appear in orderly fashion, thus making them more understandable and easier to locate. It is not our intention in any manner to make any material changes in the laws.

With the above in mind, your Committee therefore feels that further time should be granted in order to complete this work, and we may also suggest that upon such completion, the Executive Council may be given the authority to pass upon and approve our completed report and the laws as recodified and recast, and the said Executive Council be further permitted to order such laws to be printed in final form.

Motion made by A. Van Hulle of No. 17 and seconded by Grand Senior Woodward M. L. Rapheld that a resolution be drawn up to display and fly the American Flag. Motion carried. The Grand Chief Ranger appointed on the Committee, A. Van Hulle of No. 17, P. S. C. R. Cecil P. Rendon and H. Jacoby of No. 253.
