


Among their number are football and basketball stars, last year's track captain, leaders in all branches of school activities, and students, high in scholastic standing.

How has it been accomplished?


In football the class offers some good material that bids fair to star in the future. Five sophomores earned circle "L's," while several others were awarded block "L's."

The sophomore girls won first place in volley ball and second place in both tennis doubles and hockey. Although there were no outstanding players, the sophomores were recognized for their good teamwork.


In February the class presented a very successful comedy, "Officer 666," with Malcolm Graham and Ernie Walth heading a strong cast.
