I trust that you will not accuse me of trying to preach;


I have no presents now on you to bestow

Football

In Football, for the first time, Manteca has turned out a championship team. The Buffaloes started the season with an experienced team and smashed their way to the front.

The season started with three practice games. October 1, a jolly bunch of Buffaloes went to Stockton, where they presented the Stockton "B's" the short end of a 26-0 score. A week later the Green and White took the best side of a 44-6 score from the Lodi "B's". October 14, the Preston team went home with seven out of a 34-7 score.

The first League game was October 21, when the Buffaloes battered the swiftly moving Oakdale Brownies. It was a hard fought game and the M.U.H.S. players brought home the bacon. The score was 7-0.

On October 28, for the first time in Manteca's Football history, the Buffaloes crushed the Sonora team. The Wildcats went back to the mountains with the wrong end of a 20-0 score.


The Tracy game of November 4 was a league game. The Tracy dopesters promised Manteca defeat by three touchdowns. After a well played game the Tracy Bulldogs were discovered holding the sack while the Buffaloes walked away with 20-0 victory.

The Buffaloes now desired to meet a team which would offer genuine resistance; so they tackled the M.U.H.S. Alumni November 11, winning by a score of 13-9.

As the Buffaloes had won all games near home they attacked the Hughson Highlanders November 18. Ed Forsell, captain, was injured in this game. Although handicaped, the Buffaloes won, capturing the Southern Division Northern Section C.I.F. Championship by a score of 7-0.

So far the Green and White team had found smooth sailing. On December 3rd the Buffaloes journeyed to Roseville. After a three hour drive which deadened the players, the captainless Buffaloes fought a larger and heavier team. Though the Roseville players had the benefit of the breaks and won by a score of 7-0, the active driving Manteca Buffaloes, really outplayed them. With this game went the Northern State "B" class championship.





Varsity Basketball

After winning the first league game, the varsity basketball team expected a successful year, but their expectations fell flat when they were defeated by all their remaining opponents. Coach Mellow and captain Emil Theiler brought the team through a difficult season only to find themselves at the bottom of the league. As a combination, Theiler, Meza, Forsell, Benincasa and Hale gave Manteca her best start.

Forwards in the squad were Theiler, Meza and Hogrefe; centers were Forsell and Gubbins while Benincasa, Youngblood and Hale held down

guard positions.

The Buffaloes won the first league game against Turlock by a score of 28 to 19, losing the return game by a score of 27 to 12. The two games with Modesto were lost by scores of 32 to 18 and 27 to 18. Oakdale added to the Buffaloes' defeats by two scores of 31 to 13 and 33 to 29. A better showing is expected next year.

Second Varsity Basketball

Like the varsity, the seconds met heavy weather this year. With Captain "Red" Cosgriff to lead them, the squad fought a hard, tough,

losing battle.

For a starting combination, Nascimento, Bianchi, "Whit" Gubbins, Cosgriff, and Candini, proved good, fast fighters. Members of the squad were: forwards, Nascimento, Bianchi and De Simas; centers, Moore and

Gubbins; guards, Candini and Cosgriff.

In practice games, the seconds lost to the Lodi seconds by a score of 14 to 5; to the Druids by 14 to 11; and to Ripon by 21 to 11. In league games they lost to the Turlock seconds by scores of 22 to 16 and 39 to 13. The Oakdale seconds took two games by scores of 18 to 2 and 25 to 19. Manteca seconds, however, broke even with the Modesto seconds, losing one game by 13 to 3 score and winning one by a 30 to 22 score.

Though basketball was not successful this year in regard to scores, new material has shown up and prospects are bright for a championship

team next year.


