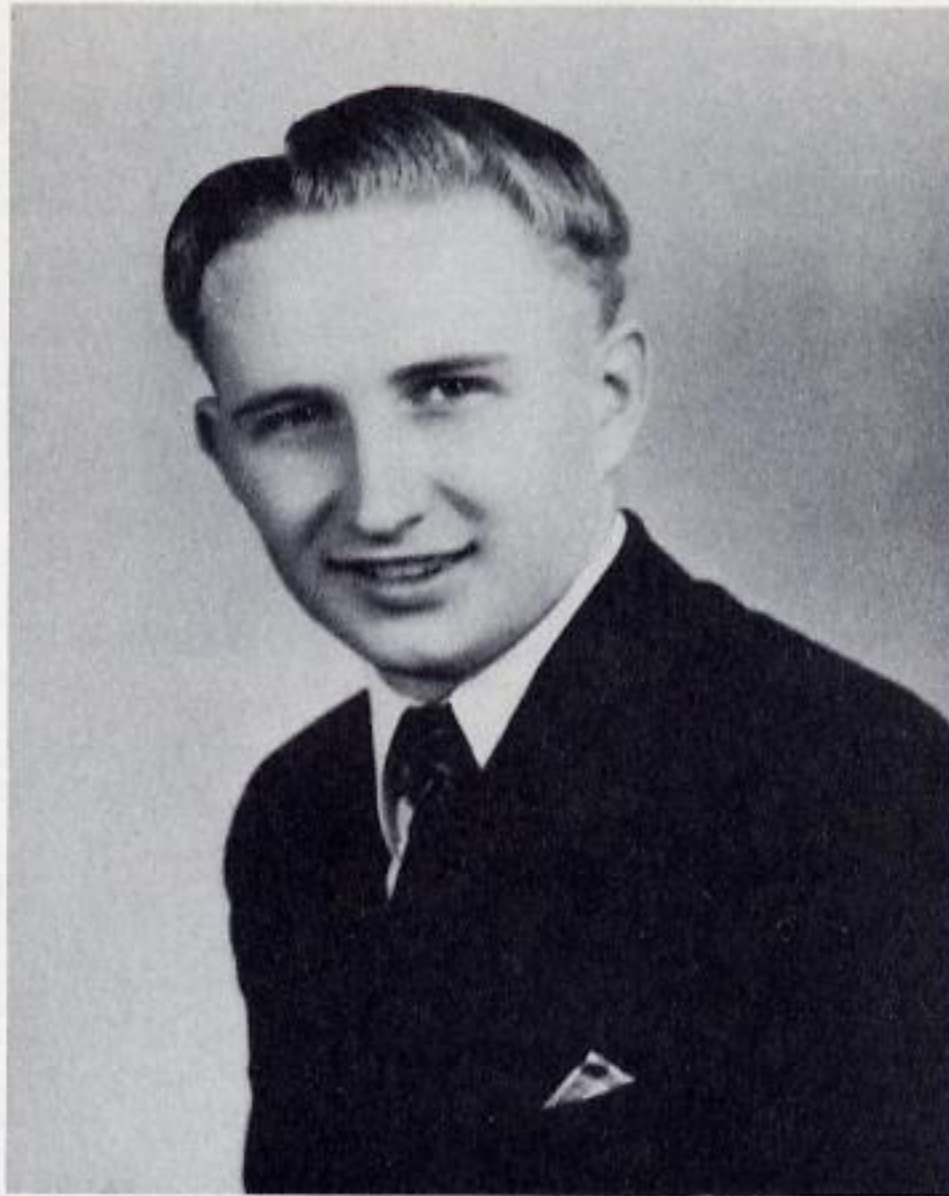

## PRINCIPAL INTERPRETS PATRIOTIC DUTY IN ANNUAL MESSAGE TO STUDENT BODY

"To do his individual part in his particular place for war or for peace is the essence of patriotism," stated Mr. Spriggs in his annual message to the student body, Tuesday, April 7.

Relating the present day situation to the students he commented, "As the school year draws to a close we find ourselves drawn into the maelstrom of total war with the powers of totalitarianism. Our physical and mental capabilities are of necessary directed toward early victory in this conflict but in achieving military supremacy we must insure social, moral, and spiritual betterment as well."

According to Mr. Spriggs, during times of national stress we are prone to cut corners and shorten

the educational program wherever possible to meet the emergency.

"Let us remember, however," he continued, "that real education is measured in personal growth, development, maturity, and understanding; qualities which cannot be achieved by get-rich-quick methods."

As to the students' duties in this war-torn world Mr. Spriggs said, "In this turbulent world our patriotic duty is clear and plain. Those who are called upon to serve their country under arms will do so with courage and perseverance; while those who are called upon to build the peace that surely must follow will prepare themselves by careful study, conscientious work, and genuine enthusiasm."
