All games that are to be played will be purely for amusement. All awards will be made up of points for the awards regular batting average.

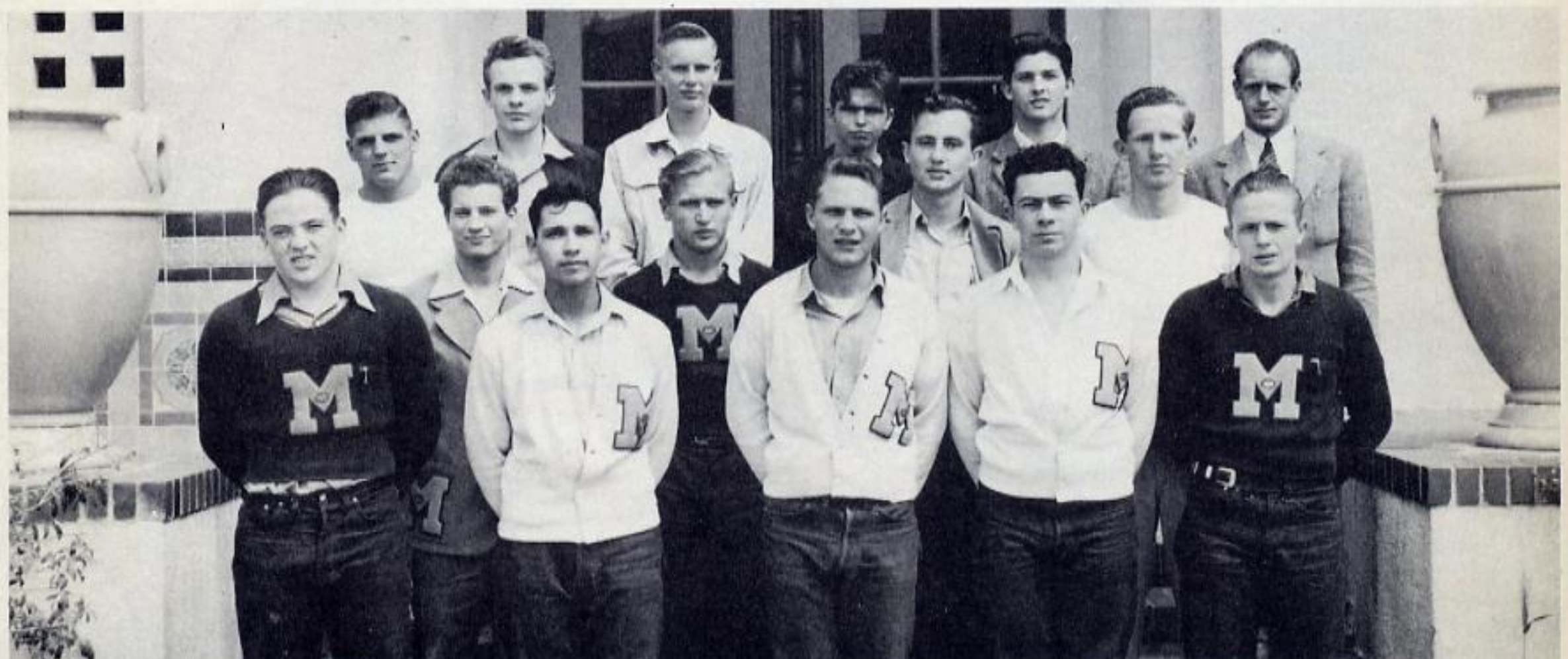
BOYS TO HAVE INTERMURAL GAMES

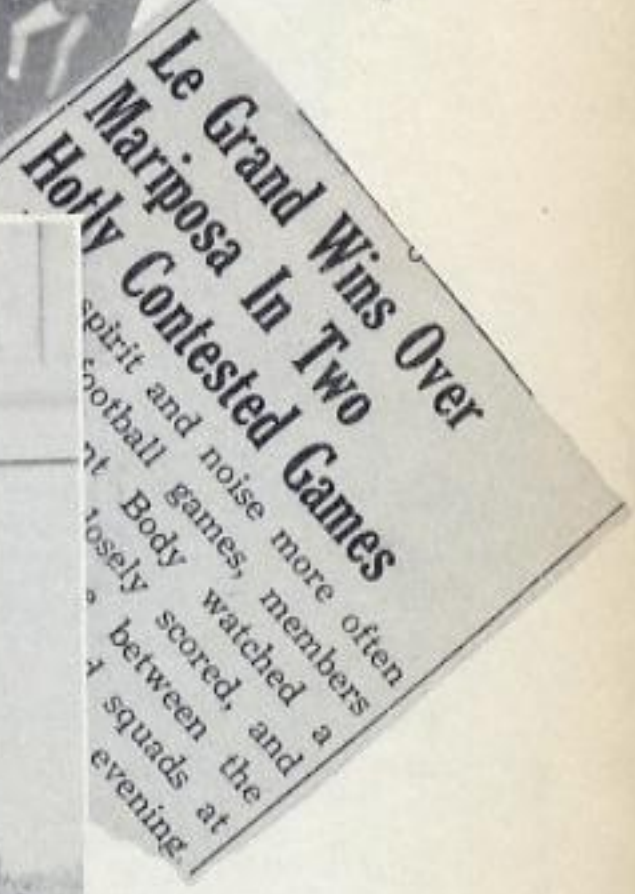
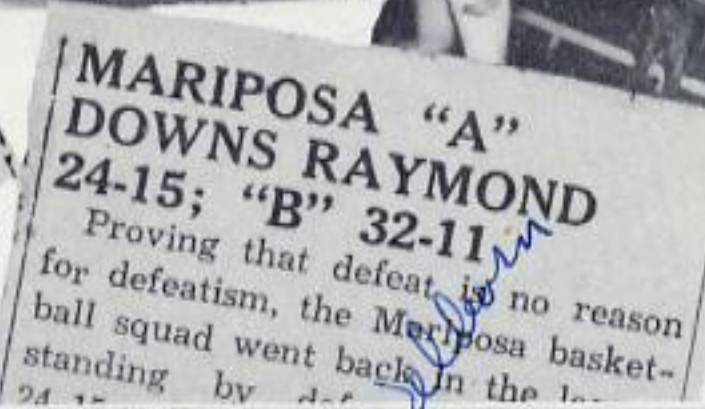

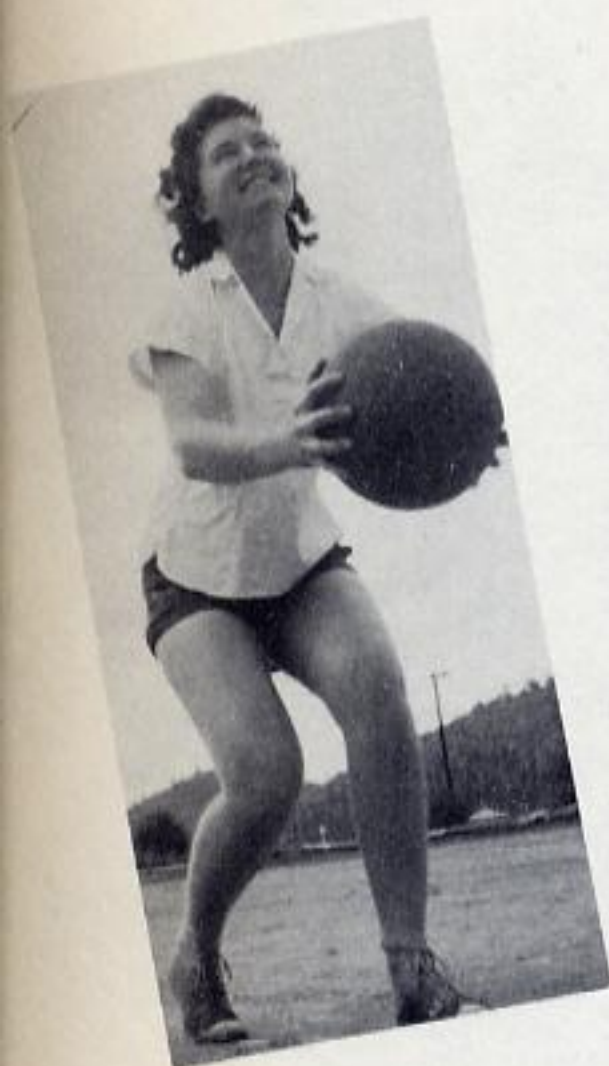
