





FOOTBALL


However, the team as a whole did not have too successful a season. Although our fighting five lost some games, as the scores testify, they lost by only a few points.





TRACK


Two shining trophies have been added to our display window. These black and gold figures were won by our A and C track teams at the Woodland Relays on April 21.

During the season, McClatchy's track teams have also had the honor of setting five new records.

In the A class, Al Baeta set a new score in the mile run with a time of 4:47.1. Jim Quan jumped a record height of 5' 8", and Richard Batelle's 19' 11/2" set a new length in the broad jump.

Two members of the C class also established records. Scott Newey jumped a phenomenal 10' 6" to set an outstanding new record in the pole-vault, and Charlie Thomas' jump of 19' 634" easily broke the old broad-jump mark.


GOLF AND TENNIS

McCLATCHY MAKES HISTORY


