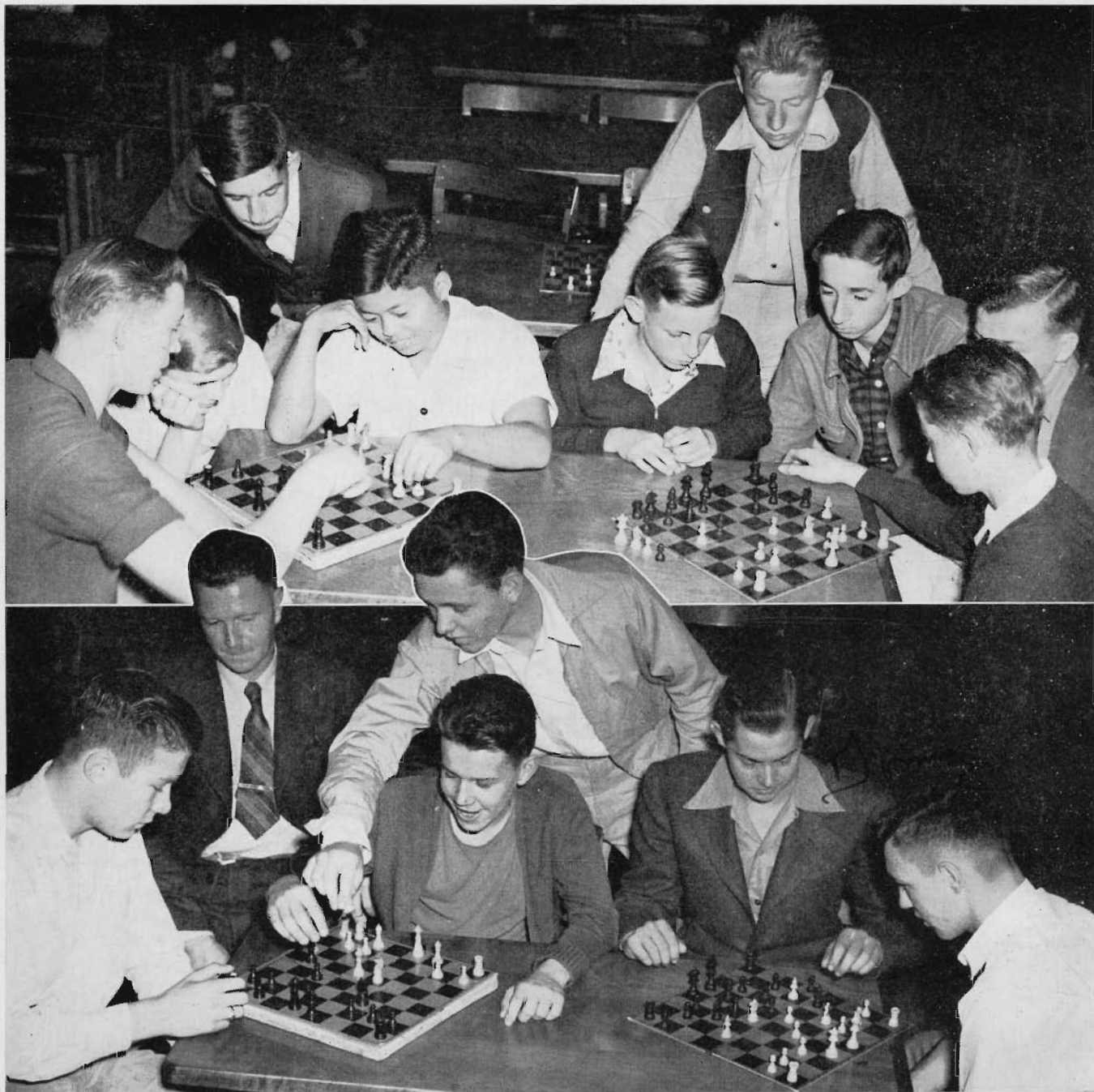
Honor Scholarship
