





Produced by the combined effort and talent of Stockton College and College of the Pacific, and directed by De Marcus Brown of the Pacific Theatre, "Sing Out, Sweet Land" was one of the most outstanding productions of the year 1950-51. This well integrated saga of American folk music, a previous broadway hit, told the story of America in chronological sequence, using ballads, work songs, dance tunes, spirituals, street cries, lullabies, blues, hymns, gambling songs, railroad, riverboat and mountain tunes. A comic motif provided the audience as well



as the players with sincere laughter. The cast included over fifty Stockton College and College of the Pacific students, and countless others took part in the singing chorus, the dancing chorus, the choir, and the orchestra. Such an undertaking also necessitated a hard-working crew of managers, electricians, wardrobe and property custodians. The final production was successfully presented to an enthusiastic audience, among whom was Dore Schary, production head for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Pictures.
























## The Colt Band










# A Cappella Choir
