







An ideal can not be greater than the faith of the men who work to fulfill it. They give it the shape of their experience.

Dr. Leon P. Minear has finished his third term as president of Stockton College. Stepping in at a time when a whole new organizational policy was being started, he took a school that was a four year institution only on paper, and began to strengthen the foundations to build a permanent Stockton College. His superior administrative ability, the prime requisite for a person in his position, has enabled him to do well his job of directing the energies of his staff into making the school. Yet, he is not a man tied down by the ball and chain of administrative detail. His big regret about his job is that he can not work with young people as much as he would like, for he rightly feels that in the students of Stockton College lies the real proof of the institution.

Stockton College's two vice presidents are not merely assistants to Dr. Minear, but are the heads of departments which in themselves take as much administration as the whole school. Dr. Burke W. Bradley, vice president and dean of administration. heads the network of offices that run the school. His department is connected with everything from mimeographing program schedules to the food in the cafeteria. Dr. David L. Greene, head of the adult education program for the city, runs one of the largest night programs in the state.

department of student problem solving: the four deans' offices


The deans of Stockton College are administrators who deal directly with the people of the college. Dr. Palmer Graver, dean of students, adjusts the individual problems of students in relation to the faculty and classes. He keeps in touch with student feeling through the deans' advisory committee. Through information given him by the representatives from basic and college and life classes, he is able to make the policies that help operate the student body. The dean in charge of curriculum is Dr. Jerome Light. He is chairman of the curriculum council which determines the courses to be offered and their subject matter. Louis Windmiller is the registrar, whose invaluable help makes it possible for easier and quicker solving of class and registering problems.

Waldo is the advisor to the student government. Taverner also works with the student government, especially with the social chairman in planning the Fun Fest, the school dances, and other social events during the year. Stockton College is a better school to go to because of the services of these five people and all the dean's men.


